This is the final audit report of findings with regard to the Office of the Medicaid Inspector General's (OMIG) Minimum Data Set (MDS) audit of Providence Rest, Inc. for the census period ending January 25, 2012. In accordance with 18 NYCRR §517.6, this final audit report represents the OMIG's final determination on issues found during OMIG's review.

Since you did not respond to our draft audit report dated October 18, 2015, the findings in the final audit report remain identical to the draft audit report.

The Medicaid overpayment of \$63,544.26 was calculated using the number of Medicaid days paid for the rate period July 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012 and the change in the direct component of your Medicaid rate as calculated by the Department of Health's Bureau of Long Term Care Reimbursement (BLTCR). The calculation of this overpayment is detailed in Attachment A. BLTCR will adjust your Medicaid rates for the relevant rate period to reflect the change in the direct component. The findings explanation, regulatory references, and applicable adjustment can be found in the attachments following Attachment A.

You have the right to challenge this action and determination by requesting an administrative hearing within sixty (60) days of the date of this notice. In accordance with 18 NYCRR §519.18(a), "The issues and documentation considered at the hearing are limited to issues directly relating to the final determination. An appellant may not raise issues regarding the methodology used to determine any rate of payment or fee, nor raise any new matter not considered by the department upon submission of objections to a draft audit or notice of proposed agency action." You may only request a hearing to challenge specific audit adjustments which you challenged in a response to the draft audit report.

If you wish to request a hearing, the request must be submitted in writing to:



Pursuant to 18 NYCRR §519.18, at the hearing you have the right to:

- (a) request the department to reschedule the hearing (adjournment);
- (b) be represented by an attorney, or other representative, or to represent himself/herself;
- (c) have an interpreter, at no charge, if the appellant does not speak English or is deaf and cannot afford one (the appellant must advise the department prior to the hearing if an interpreter will be needed);
- (d) produce witnesses and present written and/or oral evidence to explain why the action taken was wrong;
- (e) cross-examine witnesses of the department.

MDS FINDINGS

SAMPLE SELECTION

Functional Status-ADL Self-Performance and Support

If the provider is unable to produce the supporting documentation for the patient, the service will be disallowed and the Case Mix will be adjusted. A repayment schedule will be developed.

Documentation must indicate an assessment was done to evaluate the need for assistance with activities of daily living (ADL's), altered gait and balance, and decreased range of motion (ROM). MDS 3.0 manual guidelines will be followed when examining the medical records.

Bed Mobility Self-Performance

In 2 instances, documentation did not support resident required total assist every time. 5, 14

In 1 instance, documentation did not support resident required weight bearing assist three or more times. 10

In 1 instance, documentation did not support resident required supervision one or more times. 3

Bed Mobility Support Provided

In 3 instances, documentation did not support resident was a one person physical help at least once. 2, 3, 10

Transfer Self-Performance

In 1 instance, documentation did not support resident required weight bearing assist three or more times. 10

In 1 instance, documentation did not support resident required supervision one or more times. 3

Transfer Support Provided

In 1 instance, documentation did not support resident was a 2+ person physical help at least once. 9

In 3 instances, documentation did not support resident was a one (1) person physical help at least once. 2, 3, 10

Eating Self-Performance

In 1 instance, documentation did not support resident required total assist every time. 12

In 1 instance, documentation did not support resident required supervision one or more times. 15

Toilet Use Self-Performance

In 3 instances, documentation did not support resident required total assist every time. 5, 12, 14

In 2 instances, documentation did not support resident required weight bearing assist three or more times. 10, 13

In 1 instance, documentation did not support resident required supervision one or more times. 3

Toilet Use Support Provided

In 2 instances, documentation did not support resident was a 2+ person physical help at least once. 9, 13

In 1 instance, documentation did not support resident was a one person physical help at least once. 10

In 1 instance, documentation did not support resident was set up at least once. 2

Health Conditions

If the provider is unable to produce the supporting documentation for the patient, the service will be disallowed and the Case Mix will be adjusted. A repayment schedule will be developed.

Documentation must indicate health conditions that impact the resident's functional status and quality of life. MDS 3.0 manual guidelines will be followed when examining the medical records

In 1 instance, documentation did not support fever during the look back period. 5

In 1 instance, documentation did not support vomiting during the look back period. 5

Swallowing/Nutritional Status

If the provider is unable to produce the supporting documentation for the patient, the service will be disallowed and the Case Mix will be adjusted. A repayment schedule will be developed.

Documentation must indicate an assessment of conditions that could affect the residents' ability to maintain adequate nutrition and hydration. MDS 3.0 manual guidelines will be followed when examining the medical records.

In 1 instance, documentation did not support parenteral IV during the look back period. 8

Skin Conditions

If the provider is unable to produce the supporting documentation for the patient, the service will be disallowed and the Case Mix will be adjusted. A repayment schedule will be developed.

Documentation must indicate an assessment of the documented risk, presence, appearance and change of pressure ulcers. This section also notes other skin ulcers, wounds, or lesions, and documents treatment categories related to skin injury or avoiding injury. MDS 3.0 manual guidelines will be followed when examining the medical records.

In 1 instance, documentation did not support the use of pressure relieving chair or turning repositioning program . 12

In 1 instance, documentation did not support surgical wounds or open lesions. 12

Special Treatments, Procedures, and Programs

If the provider is unable to produce the supporting documentation for the patient, the service will be disallowed and the Case Mix will be adjusted. A repayment schedule will be developed.

The intent of the items in this section is to identify any special treatments, procedures, and programs that the resident received during the specific time periods. MDS 3.0 manual guidelines will be followed when examining the medical records.

In 1 instance, documentation did not support oxygen therapy during the look back period. 6

Skilled Therapy

If the provider is unable to produce the supporting documentation for the patient, the service will be disallowed and the Case Mix will be adjusted. A repayment schedule will be developed.

The qualified therapist, in conjunction with the physician and nursing staff, is responsible for determining the necessity for and the frequency and duration of the therapy provided to residents. Rehabilitation (i.e., via Speech-Language Services, and Occupational and Physical Therapies) and respiratory, psychological, and recreational therapy helps the residents to attain or maintain their highest level of well-being and improve their quality of life. MDS 3.0 manual guidelines will be followed when reviewing the documentation provided by the facility.

In 1 instance, documentation did not support medical necessity for therapy and/or therapy was not reasonable for resident condition. 4
